ABOUT REMF

ROBERT EATON was an avid Brighton & Hove Albion fan and was a regular contributor to the legendary fans' forum, North Stand Chat and its internet chat room.

Despite living and working in New York, Robert Eaton's support for the Albion remained as strong as ever and, through the internet, he was a friend to many. On the 11th September 2001, he was working on the 105th floor of the World Trade Center and it was with great sadness that the news of his death reached his fellow Albion supporters.

They were determined that Robert's name would live on through the game he loved, and the idea of holding a charity football match – with the proceeds going to provide support for a "football academy" in New York City – was met with unanimous support. Very quickly a group of organisers got together and plans were made to hold the first Robert Eaton Memorial Match. Supporters of Brighton's arch rivals, Crystal Palace, offered their services

as opposition and the inaugural match was played in November 2001.

In the weeks leading up to the match, REMF received some very generous donations of football memorabilia and other prizes which were auctioned online to raise money for the fund – raising several thousand pounds. With additional donations, the fund soon rose to over £30,000 and a year of very hard work got underway immediately after the match.

The Robert Eaton Memorial Fund was registered as a charity in the UK while in New York fellow Albion supporters

Steve McMahon and Paul Neal, worked on REMF's behalf looking for a suitable team to support. The team chosen, *Los Peladitos* came from a mainly Hispanic neighbourhood in the New York Borough of Queens, and REMF initially provided them with a 2-season package of funding for kit and other essential equipment.

Since 2004, REMF has been funding teams in the Brighton and Croydon areas.

Most recently, REMF has donated £5,000 to The Seagulls Specials, the Albion's team for children with special needs and learning

difficulties, and £1,000 to Coaching For Hope, an international programme to use football and art to empower disadvantaged children, local coaches and youth workers in the developing world, help combat the source of HIV and AIDS, and raise awareness of global poverty.

TONIGHT'S special guest needs no introduction - he is none other than **PETER WARD** - arguably the most popular player ever to don the blue and white stripes, and a constant thorn in defenders' sides throughout the late 70s and early 80s.

We are also delighted to welcome back Ricky Marlowe – a Brighton & Hove Albion forward between 1974 and 1976. Robert used the name "Ricky Marlowe's Hairpiece"

on North Stand Chat and Ricky has come down from Edinburgh to play in his eighth REMF game.

Although Marlowe and Ward were at the club at the same time, (indeed, they're standing together in the club squad photo taken at the start of the 1975-76 season), they never played together for the first team. So tonight ought to be a first.

We are also, er, delighted to 'welcome' tonight's match referee - the redoubtable **Phil Prosser**. Phil, so obviously a firm favourite with the Albion fans after officiating at Withean in 2002, makes his REMF debut, and we thank him for giving up his time to come along. I'm sure we'll all make him feel welcome. Possibly.

As ever, thanks go to our ballboys from Denton & South

Heighton team and the match officials and stewards who have all given their services to the cause tonight. Thanks also to the sponsors and to Lewes FC who have allowed us use their facilities free of charge.

And finally, we have been honoured to work with Robert's family and the support and guidance we've received from the Eatons has been inspirational.

The Robert Eaton Memorial Fund now raises money through a variety of events including the annual football game against Crystal Palace. Any help we receive allows us to continue our aim of supporting football for disadvantaged young people in a way that reflects the local and international links that Robert had with the game.
